* Clinic funding derived from billings generally involves FPs allocating a percentage of their activity-based billings toward clinic overhead. Where clinics are funded based on the patient roster - whether patients are rostered to a clinic or a provider - clinic overhead is funded by a portion of the patient roster-based earnings. Block/globally funded clinics receive a lump sum amount, which varies in terms of what that funding covers (e.g., compensation for FPs and/or RNs, clinic space). Blended clinics derive their funding from a combination of sources. Clinics in the "unclear" category did not have sufficient information to accurately classify their clinic funding.
